This program was developed by our Health Education Teachers. They have spent many hours researching the latest information available in the field of Health Education. These topics are also mandated by the New Jersey State Core Curriculum Content Standards for Health Education. Health Topics

Health 6 Course Description

This course introduces the middle school student to a comprehensive health curriculum that includes wellness; health-enhancing personal, interpersonal and life skills; and, information concerning drug and alcohol dependency, addiction and treatments, and other drugs/medicines that support a healthy, active lifestyle. All students will learn the physical, emotional and social aspects of human relationships, human sexuality, puberty, HIV/AIDS, HPV, Sexually Transmitted Infections and pregnancy. In addition to the state mandates, students will learn safety and first aid skills along with personal/self-development.

Health 7 Course Description

This course emphasizes health promotion measures that enable middle level students to make informed choices now and in the future. This is achieved through an understanding of the body systems, their functions, related diseases; substance abuse, dependency addiction and refusal skills; the diversity of families and human relationships; sex roles and stereotypes; physical/emotional changes during puberty; reproduction and contraception with an emphasis on abstinence; HIV/AIDS, HPV, STIs and pregnancy.

Health 8 Course Description

Health education is a rapidly changing and evolving discipline with a distinct body of knowledge and skills. This course is grounded in scientifically-based research and public health knowledge. Students are empowered to develop and demonstrate increasingly sophisticated knowledge, skills, attitudes and practices regarding wellness.

This course focuses on nutrition, the digestive system, eating disorders and disease caused by nutritional deficiencies; drug and alcohol abuse, addiction, dependency with emphasis on peer influence, decision-making/refusal skills; relationships and the impact of early sexual activity; teen pregnancy and its effect on the family and society; the pros/cons of various methods of contraception with an emphasis on abstinence; HIV/AIDS, HPV, STIs, pregnancy.
